## Minutes:


- Joseph Angelo called the meeting to order at 10:19am
- Introduction / Coffee & Snacks
  - Attendees: Joseph Angelo (New Mexico State Library), Heather McClure (Fray Angélico Chávez History Library), Gloria Zamora (Nuevo Mexicano Heritage Arts Museum), Jennifer Berkley (Nuevo Mexicano Heritage Arts Museum), Jana Gottshalk (Nuevo Mexicano Heritage Arts Museum), Kyle Olmon (Museum of International Folk Art), Sarah Obenauf (New Mexico State Library), Katherine Miles (New Mexico State Library), Amy Boggess (New Mexico Department of Transportation), Bradley Carrington (New Mexico State Library), Abby Smith (New Mexico Museum of Art)
- Approve the agenda
  - Joseph proposed amendment to agenda: adding to new business an update on the Museum of Indian Arts and Culture. Abby moved to approve agenda as amended; seconded; passed.
- Comments from the public
  - No comments from the public.
- News from member libraries
  - NMHAM: Library Committee is now active (Joseph Angelo is a member); working on collection development policy (especially the policy on donations); NMSL helped/continues to help with classification and bib records; solved spine label fading problem (thermal printer)

- NMDOT: Library recently reopened (collection had been in storage several years); library is part of NMDOT's Research Bureau, with patrons limited to bureau staff and exploring whether to open to outsiders; library is also part of national network of libraries at state DOTs (<https://transportation.libguides.com/ntkn>); also working on a collection development policy, with a special focus on weeding; on the hunt for catalog records that describe online resources
- OSE: librarian contract position still unstaffed
- NMHM: digital usage stats are increasing significantly; director is retiring at end of January 2026; new deputy (Maria Sanchez-Tucker, former director of SFPL) starts in January 2026
- MOIFA: currently has 3 volunteers with a student from UNM starting soon; in the process of joining NM Digital Collections (<https://econtent.unm.edu>); recently received big batch of donations and shared them with MOA; recent donation of a treasure-stuffed suitcase, published in China and not held by any library on WorldCat (that is to say, requires original cataloging); Kyle will try using OCLC's new subject cataloging AI tool
- NHCC: Amy Padilla attended Guadalajara International Book Fair ([https://www.fil.com.mx/ingles/info/info\\_fil.asp](https://www.fil.com.mx/ingles/info/info_fil.asp)); purchased over 50 books; won a grant from NM Gas to purchase equipment for a childrens' makerspace; will be supervising another pre-literacy intern (position will be advertised soon)
- MOA: Abby presented at NMLA on library flood; book sale was very successful; awarded a \$5k grant to purchase zines; working on finding aid for Axle Contemporary archive collection
- NMSL: Symphony de-dup of bibs (only ~250 exact matches); robot will finish work soon; helping with cataloging for MOIFA, NHCC, NMAM; waiting for approval to offer positions to candidates for Deputy State Librarian and a supervisor position in Public Services ; cataloger position has been vacant for over a year
- Old business
  - Update on NM State Archives joining SALSA
    - No update at this time. MOU has not been signed.
  - Reminder: don't put copy information in the call number
    - Example: 373.78956 S77486 1947|**ZC. 1** – delete the pipestem and everything following. Copy information goes in the **Copy number** field under **Item information** (see screenshots on final page)
- New business

- NMDOT Library joining SALSA
  - Welcome NMDOT and their fearless librarian, Amy Boggess!
- MIAC update
  - Migration to Symphony and SALSA is forthcoming. End goal is to have migration completed before a new librarian is hired
  - Records will be migrated from Koha
  - NMSL staff are working at LOA until a new librarian is in place
- Bibliographic Heading Flip update
  - Completed in July. Older bibliographic headings are updated to the current form.
- Using the web version of Symphony
  - NMSL TSB recommends using SymphonyWeb. There is nothing to install, you can access it from anywhere with an internet connection, and it is always running the most up-to-date version.
- SirsiDynix consulting credits status/update
  - If you have any report/product needs, let Sarah know (current projects with Sirsi include Enterprise branding for NMDOT and creating a book carousel for MLPL)
- OCLC AI Macros discussion
  - Kyle will test out the AI macros. We look forward to hearing about his experience and thoughts!


Correct use of |Z in call number field (volume and issue)
